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Plans for our 2024-25 HAF programme

Introduction

The Holiday Activities & Food Programme (HAF) is funded by the Department for Education to provide free healthy meals and enriching activities to children from low-income families. Derby has over 14,500 children who receive benefits related free school meals and Derby Poverty Commission's data suggests that 38.3% of children are living in poverty, and the numbers are rising.

Poverty has been shown to manifest itself in numerous ways, and children in a household experiencing poverty will be more prone to experience a household with mental illness, domestic violence, neglect, parental separation, and forms of abuse which serve to further compound the detrimental effects that children in poverty experience daily.

Research has shown that the school holidays can be pressure points for some low-income families. For some children that can lead to a holiday experience gap. Children from low-income households are:

- less likely to access organised out-of-school activities
- more likely to experience 'unhealthy holidays' in terms of nutrition and physical health
- more likely to experience social isolation

There are many benefits for children who attend the HAF programme. We want to encourage all HAF providers to ensure a high-quality experience that will result in children:

- · receiving healthy and nutritious meals
- maintaining a healthy level of physical activity
- being happy, having fun and meeting new friends
- developing a greater understanding of food, nutrition and other health related issues
- taking part in fun and engaging activities that support their development and well-being feeling safe and secure
- getting access to the right support services
- returning to school feeling engaged and ready to learn

Partnership with Community Action Derby

Our partnership with Community Action Derby (CAD) enabled the HAF programme to work closely with Derby's local Voluntary and Community organisations. These providers were already embedded in their communities, meaning parents could access provision local and familiar to them. This partnership ensured the programme was varied, accessible, culturally appropriate and linked in with a wider network of nonstatutory support. CAD also provide a city wide 'cost of living' website and phone line, giving providers a 'one stop shop' to signpost families to additional statutory and voluntary sector support.

During 2023 – 2024, more than £1 million was invested in the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) sector, keeping that money within Derby's communities and creating employment and volunteering opportunities for local people. Through the wider support available via the HAF programme, VCSE organisations were able to build their capacity, accessing training for staff development and achieving accreditations such as OFSTED and Food Business registration.

HAF provider 'Vox Feminarium' addresses community needs by offering assistance on critical issues such as housing, education, environmental concerns, and overall wellbeing. More immediate community needs are addressed through their food and clothing bank and community shop provision.

Finance and impact

Derby City Council receives funding for the HAF programme from the Department for Education. The Department of Education has invested over £200 million each year nationally for the three years of the HAF programme. The funding is allocated to local authorities based on the number of children who receive benefits-related free school meals.

Marketing

Working closely with Derby City Council's Communications and Marketing Team, Derby's HAF programme has been promoted widely across the city, including:

- Lamppost banners in three key areas of the city, on main traffic and footfall routes
- Digital advertising on bus stops
- A targetted local radio campaign
- Posters, flyers and postcards issued to schools and community settings
- Advertising banners outside schools and HAF venues

HAF has received positive press coverage during the year. A visit from the Department for Education's social media team to Baby People resulted in national online coverage, and Radio Derby featured Community One in an extended interview celebrating their work supporting the local community.

Supporting children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities


We have seen a significant increase in the number of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities accessing the HAF programme. Most of the professional referrals received were to support children with additional needs.

We were proud to work with some of Derby's specialist providers in 2023/24 who specialise in supporting children with Special Educational Needs & Disabilities.

- Endorphins dance, drama, arts & crafts, gaming and other activities in safe, supportive and inclusive sessions
- Freedom Foundation street dance and hip hop techniques, dance routines, and keeping fit
- Inspiritive Arts providing arts therapies (art, drama, dance, music therapies) and well-being arts
- Spirit and Soul equine therapy in an outdoor, farm-based setting
- St. James Centre Funabili8y activities, games and trips, helping disabled young people live life to the max!
- Umbrella games, sports, arts and crafts

Professional referral scheme

Though most of our funding is for supporting children and young people who receive free school meals, a small amount of discretionary funding is available for others who may benefit from the HAF programme.

By working with professional partners across the city, including social workers, family support workers and schools SEND teams, during 2023 we have supported an additional 136 children and young people who may otherwise have been isolated or at risk during the holidays.



Quality assurance and training

Ensuring that our HAF provision is of high quality and is meeting the needs of Derby's children and young people is key to the programme.

During 2023, all our HAF providers were visited at least once by members of the HAF team. The visits are a chance to see the clubs in action, speak to staff, volunteers and children and sometimes to join in and have fun!

The visits are to ensure that all the HAF standards are being met, but also offer a chance to support providers in any areas where they may need advice or guidance.

In order to ensure standards remain high, a programme of training was delivered. During 2023/24 Derby HAF has supported:

- 9 new Ofsted registrations
- 22 newly trained Paediatric First Aiders
- 96 staff and volunteers qualified Level 2 Food Hygiene training
- All providers attended mandatory safeguarding training
- Access to Trauma and Attachment training
- Behaviour Management & Conflict Resolution training

10 **Food**

Every child attending a HAF club received a meal during their day. HAF providers worked with a range of community-based food providers and many cook on site, allowing the flexibility to adapt to children's needs and giving the children opportunities to get involved in the food preparation.

HAF providers had access to free Level 2 Food Hygiene training during the year, enabling staff and volunteers to achieve a qualification and ensuring the highest possible standards.

Derby's HAF providers respond well to the needs of our communities. Young people fasting during Ramadan were supported with food packages that could be taken home to be eaten later in the evening.

| 11 | Nutrition and healthy lifestyles

HAF providers delivered support and quidance on nutrition and healthy lifestyles in a variety of creative ways, including:

- Cooking and baking sessions
- Blindfolded taste tests
- Making fruit and vegetable animals
- Using inspirational sports people as healthy role models
- Creating online video clips sharing cookery demonstrations

Younger children enjoyed play based sessions to learn about nutrition, including vegetable printing and creating fruit and vegetable animals, and running their own pretend pizza restaurant.

Many of our providers working with older children were able to deliver wellbeing sessions to address topics including managing anxiety and depression, drugs and alcohol, managing use of digital technology and social media, managing sleep issues and dental care.

Physical activity is a key element of the HAF programme and during the year children and young people had the chance to try out some fantastic sports and activities, including:

The HAF programme has provided children and young people across Derby with a huge range of exciting and enriching activities, including:




Signposting

The strong partnership between Derby City Council and Community Action Derby ensures that HAF providers have access to a wide range of information and support. All HAF providers are given a pack containing contact details for support organisations in the city, including cost of living support, benefits advice, housing, and mental health support.

HAF providers have shared with us some of the feedback from families who have expressed their appreciation for their children being able to access food and activities during this challenging cost of living crisis.

HAF providers have key roles in their local communities and have offered support to families with referrals to agencies such as Social Services, Speech and Language and to help parents begin the process of getting a diagnosis for children with undiagnosed additional needs.





"Aspire has very strong links within our community. We run warm hubs and food banks as well as our wrestling school which is heavily geared towards supporting those struggling with mental health issues. We really do recognise the sheer volume of support needed and how without HAF provision many families would have a really hard time coping during the school holidays. Case study

Community One and National Trust Hardwick Hall

Groups of children from Community One's HAF club in Normanton, spent one day a week of the summer holidays experiencing the stunning National Trust Hardwick Hall's 2000 acres of woodland and lakes as well as exploring the Tudor mansion. The children took part in a Junior Rangers programme, including pond dipping, bug hunting, nature walks and the chance to see wildlife up close and personal. The sessions received positive feedback from children and parents.

16 **Case study**

FusionScape

Community based provider FusionScape worked with a group of refugee and asylum seeker families living in hotel accommodation in the centre of Derby. Children from countries including Afghanistan, Eritrea and Columbia attended the club, taking part in music lessons, sports and dance.

Involvement in the club has gone from strength to strength, with some family members gaining qualifications to enable them to volunteer at the club, running football and basketball sessions for young people.

Plans for our 2024-25 HAF programme

2024 offers the opportunity to build on the success of the HAF programme so far, with plans in place for:

- Supporting 9 new providers in Derby, broadening the HAF offer for young people.
- Increasing the range and number of places for older teens, with offers including a BMX based club and free gym passes.
- Embedding the unique code system, ensuring that the HAF programme is for those families most in need.
- Ensuring that all HAF providers are registered with Derby City Council as Food Businesses, ensuring the highest standards.
- Working closely with partners from Active Derbyshire to develop a training programme to improve the inclusion of young people with special educational needs and disabilities in physical activity.
- Creating stronger links with the wider childcare offer in Derby, including Wraparound Provision to ensure more support to families.
- Reviewing the three-year HAF Programme to ensure Derby is in the best possible position to deliver a future HAF programme if funding is confirmed.
