VOTER ID

The elections on Thursday 4 May 2023 will be one of the biggest local elections in Derby in recent memory. All 51 Councillors will be up for election and the successful candidates will stay in power for the next four years.

The changes for this year don't stop there. In April 2022, the Government passed the Elections Act 2022 which requires all voters to show an accepted form of photo ID at polling stations in Parliamentary, local and Police and Crime Commissioner elections. This is known as Voter ID.

Most forms of photo ID can be used but if you don't have one you will need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. This is a temporary form of ID issued by Derby City Council that will allow you to vote in the 2023 Local Elections.

Your ID proves that you are who you say you are when voting, and prevents someone else from using your vote. Proxy voters will also have to show their own ID to vote on another person's behalf.
