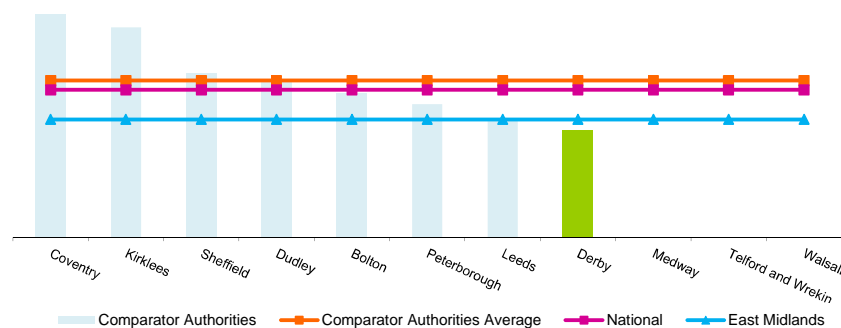
**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team -**

Derby had 213 looked after children aged ten or over on 31st March 2017 and seven of these were convicted or subject to a final warning or reprimand during 2016-17. This equates to a percentage of 3.3% which is a decrease from the 2015-16 percentage of 5.1%. Derby is below the national average by 1.2% and also below the comparator authority average by 1.5%.

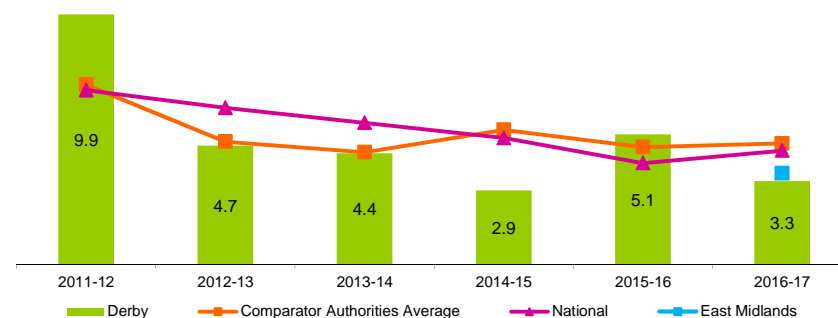

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's completion rate of dental checks has increased from 80.0% in 2015-16 to 84.1% for 2016-17, an increase of 4.1 percentage points. The 2016-17 percentage ranks us third in our comparator group above Medway (73.4%) and Sheffield (79.8%). The change for Derby between 2010-11 (69.7%) and 2016-17 (84.1%) is an increase of 14.4 percentage points.

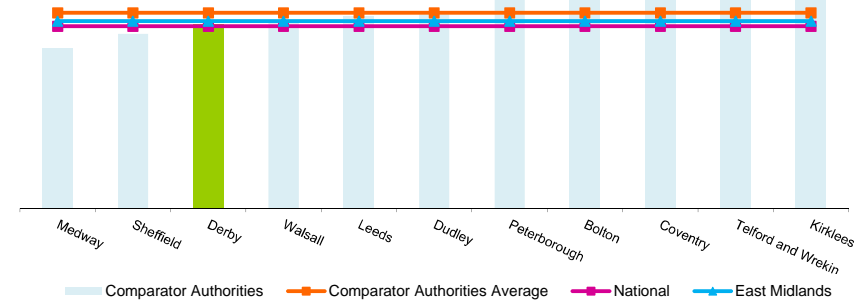
The Comparator Authorities average remained at 89.5% during 2016-17.

The national percentage has decreased again for the second year running down from 84.1% to 83.4% between 2015-16 and 2016-17, a decrease of 0.7 percentage points. In contrast, it has increased by 1.4 percentage points between 2010-11 and 2016-17 (82.0% to 83.4%) In 2016-17, Derby performed higher than the national average (84.1% compared to 83.4%).

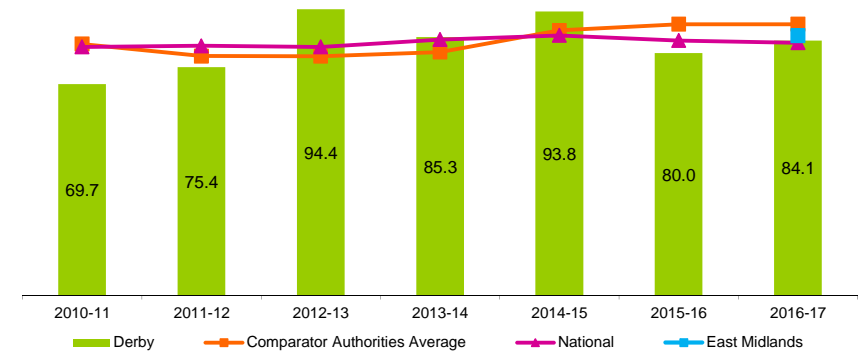

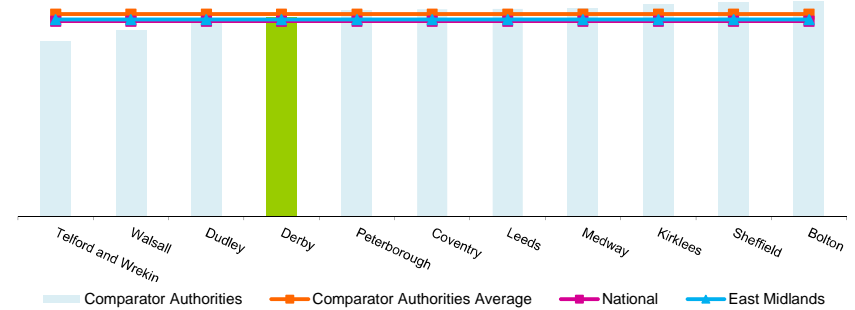

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's completion rate of annual health assessments has increased from 87.5% in 2015-16 to 91.2% in 2016-17, an increase of 4.6 percentage points. The 2016-17 percentage is the highest that has been achieved for Derby over the past seven years and is higher than the national and East Midlands averages. Derby ranks fourth in our comparator group above Telford and Wrekin (80.3%), Walsall (85.5%) and Dudley (88.4%).

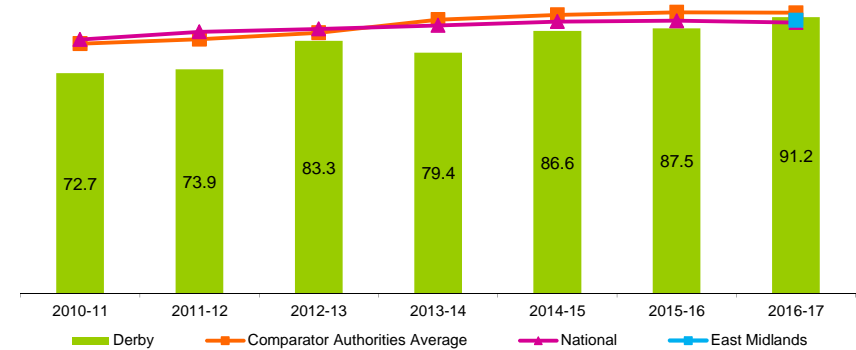
The Comparator Authorities average percentage has decreased slightly from 92.8% to 92.6% between 2015-16 and 2016-17, a change of -0.2 percentage points. Also in contrast to Derby, the national percentage has shown a very slight decrease between 2015-16 (90.0%) and 2016-17 (89.4%), a change of -0.6 percentage points.

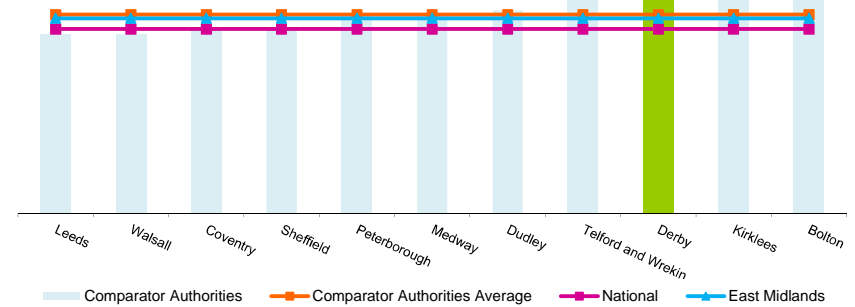

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's completion rate of immunisations has decreased from 100% (2015-16) to 97.7% (2016-17), a decrease of 2.3 percentage points. Even after a slight decrease Derby's 2016-17 performance remains higher than the comparator and national averages for the seventh year running.

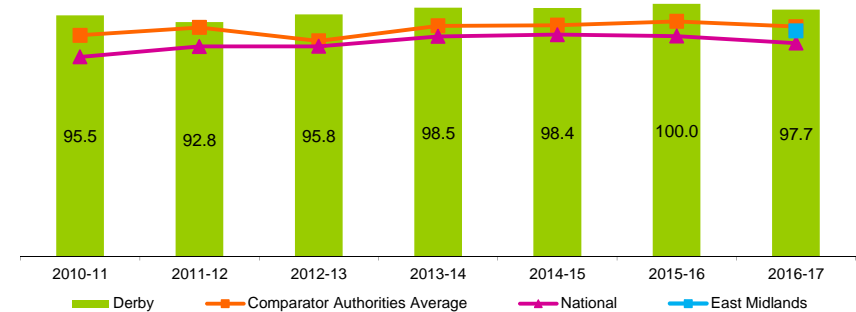
The Comparator Authorities average percentage has decreased from 93.0% (2015-16) to 91.0% (2016-17). The national percentage has also decreased from 87.2% (2015-16) to 84.4% (2016-17). This is a decrease of 2.8 percentage points and is the lowest national percentage seen over the past four years.

% of LAC who had up to date immunisations during 2016-17

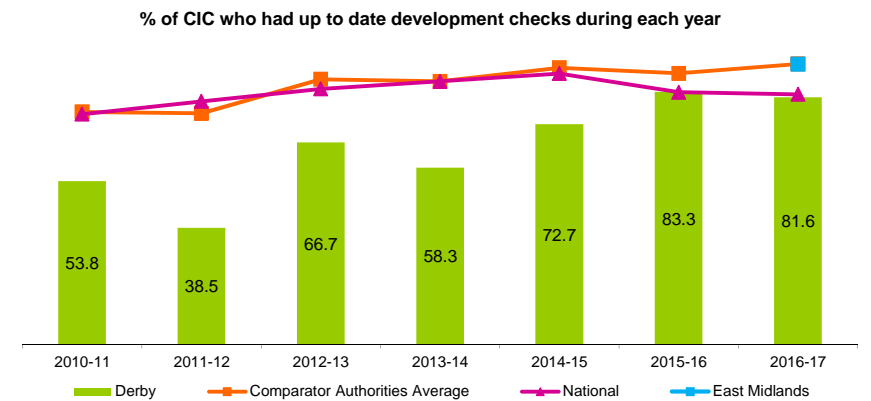
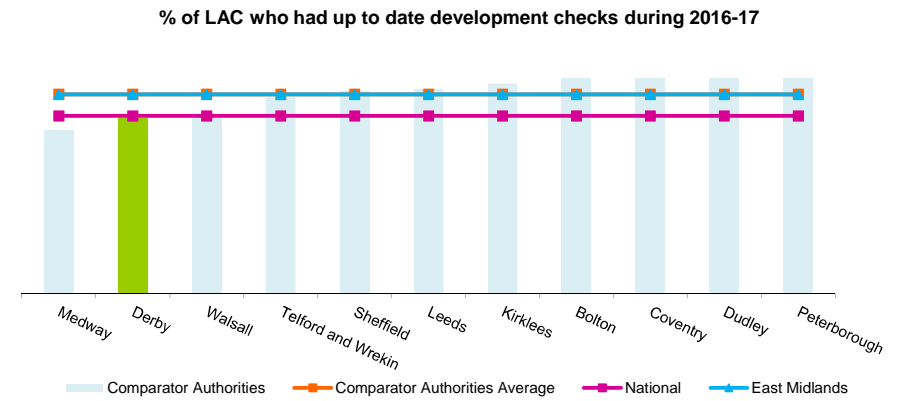


% of LAC who had up to date immunisations during each year

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's completion rate of development assessments has decreased slightly between 2015-16 (83.3%) and 2016-17 (81.6%), a change of -1.7 percentage points. Derby is ranked second bottom in our comparator group above Medway (76.6%). Derby remains below the national and comparator authority averages for the seventh year running.

The Comparator Authorities average percentage has increased between 2015-16 (89.4%) and 2016-17 (92.5%), a change of +3.1 percentage points.

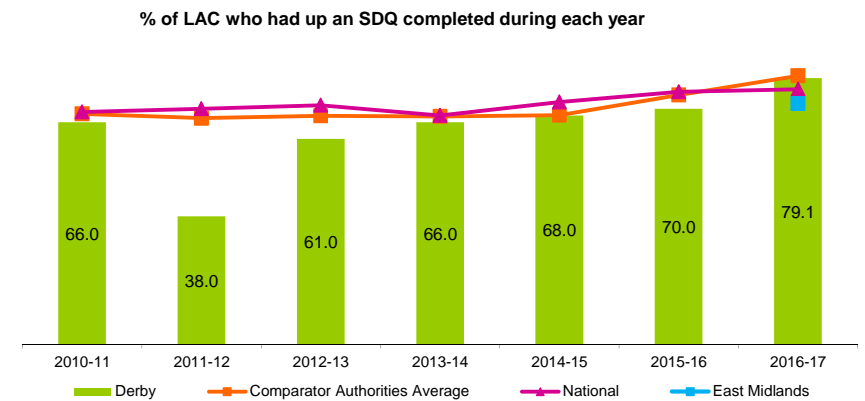
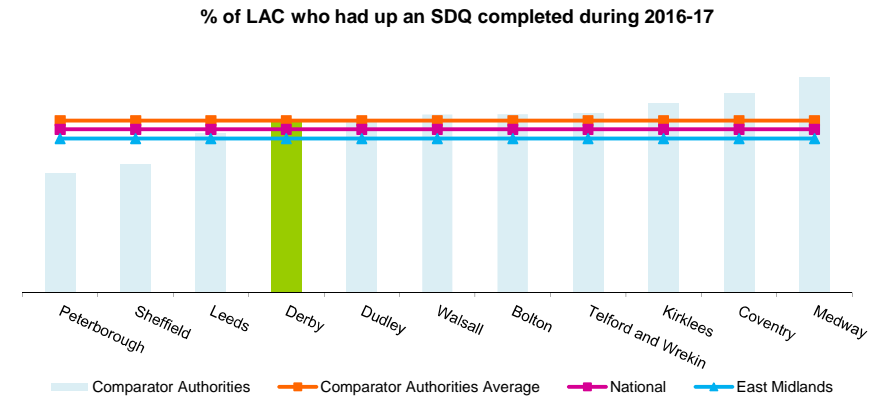
The national percentage decreased between 2015-16 (83.2%) and 2016-17 (82.5%), a change of -0.7 percentage points.

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's percentage of children for whom an SDQ score has been submitted has increased significantly from 70.0% (2015-16) to 79.1% (2016-17) a change of +9.1 percentage points. In 2016-17, Derby performed higher than the national average for the first time in seven years (79.1% compared to 75.8%).

The Comparator Authorities average percentage has increased from 74.1% to 79.8% between 2015-16 and 2016-17, a change of +5.7 percentage points.

The national performance increased slightly from 75.0% in 2015-16 up to 75.8% in 2016-17. The Department for Education introduced a minimum completion rate of 75% for 2016-17 and this has been achieved nationally with a performance of 75.8%. Derby achieved 79.1% which is well above the 75% target.

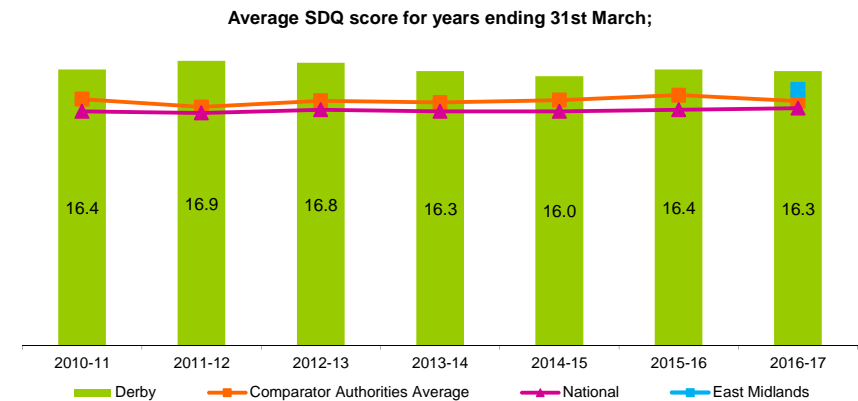
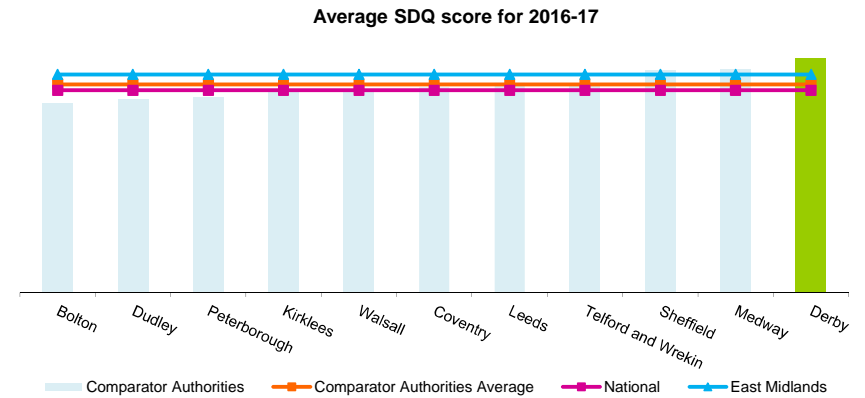

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - Derby's SDQ average score per child has decreased from 16.4 in 2015-16 to 16.3 in 2016-17, a decrease of 0.1 point. Derby's average score over the past seven years is 16.4. The lowest average score seen in Derby was 16.0 in 2014-15, the highest average score was seen in 2011-12 with a score of 16.9. Derby is ranked highest in our comparator group and is ranked 12th highest in the country. The highest score in the country was seen in Brent (19.9). Derbyshire was ranked 14th highest in the country with an average score of 16.2.

The Comparator Authorities SDQ average score has decreased from 14.9 in 2015-16 to 14.5 in 2016-17, a decrease of 0.4 points. The national SDQ score increased very slightly from 14.0 in 2015-16 to 14.1 in 2016-17, a increase of 0.1 point. The national average has been very stable over all of the years 2010-11 to 2016-17.

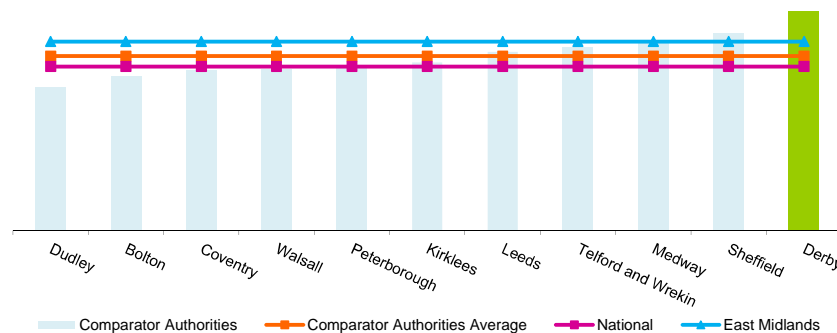

**Commentary from Performance and Intelligence Team** - In 2016-17, Derby's percentage of children for whom an SDQ score has been submitted with a score of 17 or over is significantly higher than the national average (51.1% compared to 38.1%).

Derby's percentage of 51.1% is the highest in our comparator group and is ranked 9th nationally for the highest percentage with scores of 17 and over, "cause for concern". Brent has the highest percentage in England with a percentage of 62.4%. Derbyshire also features in the authorities with high percentages ranking 14th in the country (48.5%) as does Leicestershire with a ranking of 11th in the country with a figure of 50.0%.
