1) Introduction

Derby City Council recognises the issues surrounding fuel poverty and seeks to address these by every available means. One approach by Government to reduce fuel poverty is to subsidise the cost of installing insulation or more efficient heating systems in homes. The way this operates is for the larger energy companies (those with more than 250,000 customers) to add money to household energy bills to pay for it. This scheme is called the **Energy Company Obligation.**

The energy companies use the money collected to help fund measures that reduce the cost of heating a home. Up to 10% of this money can be spent through **Local Authority Flexible Eligibility (LA-flex).**

LA-flex allows the Council to nominate households who wouldn't otherwise qualify for financial assistance towards having more efficient heating and/or insulation installed in their home.

2) Fuel Poverty

The percentage of fuel-poor households in Derby is above the national average, and higher than over three-quarters of local authority areas in the East Midlands. (DECC Sub-Regional Fuel Poverty Statistics 2014 updated June 2016; table 2).

3) Who qualifies?

The council has a simple assessment test, based on a set of scored questions (see Appendix 3). If the total household income is below a certain level *and* the household score is higher than the threshold score, the household qualifies for assistance.

STEP 1

Is the available household income, after paying the rent or mortgage, lower than the income level listed in Part 1 of the eligibility score? If 'yes', go to STEP 2.

STEP 2

Is the total of the scored questions equal or higher than the Threshold Score? If 'yes', the household qualifies for assistance as a **Fuel Poor Household**. If 'no', go to STEP 3.

STEP 3

Does any household member have any of the characteristics listed in Appendix 3, part 3. The council has discretion to qualify the household for assistance as **Vulnerable to the Health Effects of Living in a Cold Home (LIVC)**.

Alternatively if the income threshold test is met, and the property has a current EPC rating of E, F or G the household qualifies for assistance. Similarly, if any household member has any of the characteristics listed in Appendix 3, part 3 and the property has a current EPC rating of E, F or G, the council has discretion to qualify the household for assistance.

IN-FILLS

Some homeowners can receive help in paying for solid wall insulation even if they don't qualify as an **FP** or **LIVC** household. These properties are called **In-Fills**:

- "50% eligibility" refers to a directly adjoined building, meaning one of a pair of properties, for example a pair of semi-detached houses, or a ground and first-floor flat in one building. If one household qualifies, the other property is In-Fill, or
- "66% eligibility" refers to more complex examples, but follows a common theme. In a group of households (for example, a terrace or a block of flats) the eligibility of In-Fill properties is at half the rate of qualifying properties. So in a terrace of 9 properties with 4 qualifying properties, a further 2 can be In-Fill.
- "66% eligibility" criteria are in some cases subject to further clarification which for the purposes of the Statement of Intent have been omitted. Further information is available at www.ofgem.gov.uk/environmental-programmes/eco/contacts-guidance-and-resources/eco-guidance

The Council remains acutely aware that even with the financial assistance offered by the Energy Company Obligation, **FP** and **LIVC** households may still have difficulty in funding the most effective measures like solid wall insulation. In view of this the Council has discretion to offer a capped interest-free loan, repayable over up to four years, to help spread the cost of solid wall insulation. Insulated homes help keep occupiers warm and comfortable, keep energy bills low and protect against energy price rises well into the future.

Qualifying households can be nominated by the Council for energy-saving improvements in the form of a Declaration. Please note, however, that inclusion in a Declaration issued by the local authority to a supplier does not guarantee installation of measures, as the final decision does not rest with the Council and will depend on:

- The survey carried out by suppliers, agents/contractors
- Installation costs calculated
- The energy savings that can be achieved for a property
- Whether suppliers have achieved their targets or require further measures to meet their ECO targets.

4) Acting on behalf of another local authority

Derby City Council does not currently issue declarations on behalf of other local authorities.

6) Referrals

Since 2012, the Council has managed an award-winning service, the Healthy Housing Hub, which provides a wide range of services to vulnerable households. 7) Evidence, monitoring and reporting

In 2014 the independent charity The King's Fund advised that every £1 spent on improving homes saves the NHS £70 over 10 years (Report: 'Making the case for public health interventions').

A case study jointly commissioned by Derby CC and Southern Derbyshire CCG advised that targeted home improvements and modifications result in reduced risk of poor health and home accidents.

Eligibility for the service is based on the system described in Appendix 3 and may also include home visits, property surveys and provision by applicants of back-up information.

The effectiveness of the service is monitored on a case-by-case basis, in particular with reference to:

- Hazards identified
- Outcomes (up to 5 per referral)
- Improvement in personal wellbeing
- Referrals forwarded
