1) Introduction

Derby City Council recognises the issues surrounding fuel poverty and seeks to address these by every available means. One approach by Government to reduce fuel poverty is to subsidise the cost of installing insulation or more efficient heating systems in homes. The way this operates is for the larger energy companies (those with more than 200,000 customers, or 150,000 from 1st April 2020) to add money to household energy bills to pay for environmental and other social programmes designed to save energy, reduce emissions and encourage take-up of renewable energy. One such programme is the **Energy Company Obligation**, or **ECO**.

ECO is worth £640million per year and energy suppliers can volunteer to deliver up to 25% of their obligation through the **Local Authority Flexible Eligibility** scheme, or **LA-Flex** for short. This is an opportunity for Derby City Council to work alongside obligated energy suppliers for the benefit of homeowners in Derby.

LA-flex allows the Council to nominate households who wouldn't otherwise qualify for financial assistance towards having more efficient heating and/or insulation installed in their home, in the form of a Declaration. Please note, however, that inclusion in a Declaration issued by the local authority to a supplier does not guarantee installation of measures, as the final decision does not rest with the Council and will depend on:

- The survey carried out by suppliers, agents/contractors
- Installation costs calculated
- The energy savings that can be achieved for a property
- Whether suppliers have achieved their targets or require further measures to meet their ECO targets.

2) Fuel Poverty

The percentage of fuel-poor households in Derby is 13.2%. This is above the national average of 11.1%, above the East Midlands average of 11.7% and higher

than over 85% of local authority areas in the East Midlands. (BEIS Sub-Regional Fuel Poverty Statistics 2016 updated June 2018; table 2).

3) Who qualifies?

If you are an owner-occupier, the council has a simple assessment test, based on the questions in Appendix 1. If your total household net income (**after** deducting rent or mortgage) is below a level depending on the household size *and* your home is expensive to heat *or* your household includes someone who is vulnerable to living in a cold home, you qualify for assistance.

STEP 1

Is the available household income, after paying the rent or mortgage, lower than the income level listed in Part 1 of the eligibility score? If 'yes', go to:

STEP 2

Is the total of the scored questions equal or higher than the Threshold Score? If 'yes', the household qualifies for assistance as a **Fuel Poor Household**. If 'no', go to:

STEP 3

Does any household member have any of the characteristics listed in Appendix 1, part 3. The council has discretion to qualify the household for assistance as **Vulnerable to the Health Effects of Living in a Cold Home (LIVC)**.

Alternatively if the income threshold test is met, and the property has a current EPC rating of D, E, F or G, the household qualifies for assistance.

4) In-Fills

Some homeowners can receive help in paying for solid wall insulation even if they don't qualify as an **FP** or **LIVC** household. These properties are called **In-Fills**.

An **In-Fill** property is one;

- immediately adjacent to (for example, a semi-detached pair of properties), or
- in the same building as (for example, a block of flats), or
- in the same terrace as

a qualifying property. The total number of in-fill properties must not exceed the number of qualifying properties in that same building or terrace.

5) Private-sector landlords

There is a restriction on private rented properties, to reflect the separate landlord requirements to meet the minimum energy efficiency standards in the private rented sector. Only solid wall insulation and renewable measures will be eligible for EPC Band F and G properties.

6) Acting on behalf of another local authority

Derby City Council does not currently issue declarations on behalf of other local authorities.

7) City Energy Saving Programme (CESP)

The Council also manages the installation of insulation measures to private sector properties on behalf of homeowners in Derby, as a stand-alone programme. The LA-flex scheme is also available for this, and whilst the Council actively promotes the programme in those areas of the city where fuel poverty is highest, any homeowner in Derby can access the programme at any time. A household may be assessed under flexible eligibility as either 'Low Income + High Cost' (LIHC) or 'Low Income + Vulnerable [to] Cold' (LIVC) where:

1 Low income: 'LI'
