## STATEMENT OF REASONS PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER

## Derby City Council (Various Minor Amendments) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment to Map Based Schedule) (No. 148) Order 2024

Derby City Council is duty bound pursuant to Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway.

The proposed Order is in accordance with Section 1(1), of the Act as it appears to the Authority that it is expedient to make it for the purposes prescribed:

- 1. For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or any such danger arising
- 2. For facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians)
- 3. For preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs

## **Background**

As part of Traffic and Transportation 2024/25 work programme we have reviewed the existing waiting restrictions on a number of streets within the City following concerns raised by local residents and businesses regarding parking and access issues.

Following investigations and on-site observations some areas were found to have road markings that do not correspond with the current Traffic Regulation Order (TRO). In other areas some TROs have been found to be no longer required or need to be amended to improve traffic management.

It is our duty to ensure traffic and parking restrictions are valid and meaningful. The table below detail's the changes and associated traffic management grounds to amend the restrictions:
